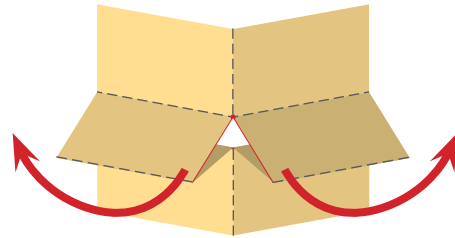
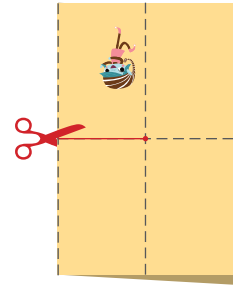


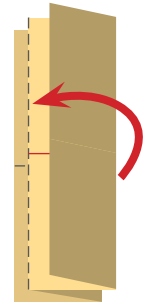
6 Fold all the pages together. Now, you have an eight-page book!



5 Now comes the tricky part. Grasp the center folds on either side of the slit and pull out and down.



4 With the paper folded in half, cut a slit along the solid line, ending at the dots. Be sure not to cut the paper in half!



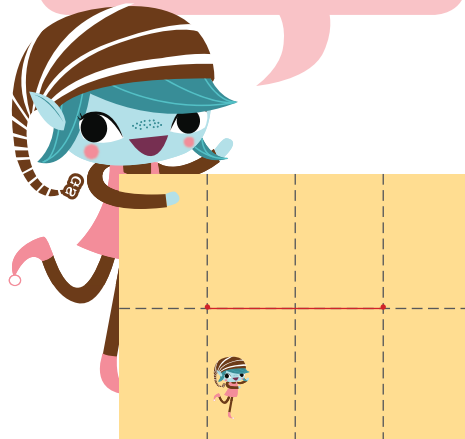
3 Fold back one edge and then the other to meet the center fold.



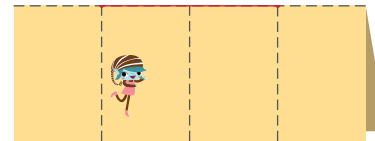

1 First fold this piece of paper in half, lengthwise.



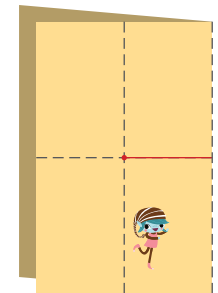
