Assist Your Brownie in Her Quest!



Dear Girl Scout Brownie Family:

During your Girl Scout Brownie's first adventure on the Brownie Quest, she discovered some of the talents and qualities that make her special. Check out page 49 of her Brownie Quest book to see how she describes herself!

At her next Girl Scout session, your Brownie will earn the Brownie Quest's very first key. But first she has one important step to take—and she needs your help.

Read the questions on the accompanying activity sheet and assist your Brownie in writing, and talking about, some simple answers to put on her star. This is a great time for you to talk with your Brownie about a value of the Girl Scout Law that is important in your family. Try to give your Brownie an example of what it means to act on a value described in the Law (such as being honest or courageous).

Your Brownie has a family star on page 51 of her Quest book—that's for her to keep. The enclosed activity sheet is for you to use with your Brownie. Or feel free to create a unique star of your own with your Brownie, using a paper plate, cardboard, aluminum foil—whatever's handy. Your Brownie will have more fun if you make a 3-D star! But if you don't have a lot of time, just use the one provided or stick with the star in your Brownie's Quest book.

If you have time, ask your Brownie to read "The ELF Adventure" with you—even just the first chapter. (See pages 10-15 in your Brownie's Quest book.) Talk about what parts interest your Brownie.
